Since then, Martha has invited those who are interested to come back and start an association for making and selling the jewelry. There are 4 dedicated women part of the association right now. Each of them went through

the training and paid a small fee to be part of the group. They have been working hard to get the flip-flops punched in order to start making the jewelry. It is exciting to see this taking off. We are hoping that this project will help to generate a good income for these women and their families. In the future we will open the association up for other women to join in, as well.
